COVID-19 Update: Friday, May 22, 2020

Governor Announces Anticipated Phase 3 of Restore Illinois Plan to Begin May 29

On Wednesday, May 20, 2020, Illinois Governor JB Pritzker announced that the Chicago region, including Lombard, is on track to move from Phase 2 to Phase 3 of the State's 5 Phase Reopen Illinois Plan, along with certain modifications. This action is pending continued trends of decreased COVID-19 statistics. Specific details on the implementation of how Phase 3 will be subject to rules from the Illinois Department of Public Health that have not yet been announced. The Village will continue to share information and updates about how Phase 3 will affect local businesses; however, the following is anticipated to be allowed, upon entry to Phase 3, beginning May 29th.

- **Restaurants Reopening for Outdoor Seating**

Restaurants are anticipated to be allowed to reopen for outdoor dining, with social distancing and additional restrictions in place. Detailed regulations will be shared when they are made available. The Village will work with local restaurants in efforts to come up with creative solutions in which businesses can reopen within the guidelines of the State's Reopen Illinois Plan. Changes to services will be reflected on the Village's Shop Local Interactive Map, available at www.villageoflombard.org/shoplocalmap.

- **Village Hall Reopening**

It is anticipated that Village Hall will reopen for in person service with limited hours on June 1. Residents are still encouraged to conduct Village business online, over the phone, or via email. This includes paying bills (www.villageoflombard.org/payabill), apply for permits (www.villageoflombard.org/onlinepermits), and report a concern via the Village's website (www.villageoflombard.org/reportaconcern). Should residents choose to access Village Hall in person, they may do so pending the State's implementation of Phase 3. Village Hall will initially reopen from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m., Monday – Thursday. Visitors must adhere to strict social distancing guidelines of no less than 6" of space between each person and must wear a mask. Questions? - **Outdoor Activities**

- State Parks will reopen including concessions (with restrictions TBD)
- Reopening of indoor and outdoor tennis facilities with safety precautions and capacity limits
- Golf courses may allow foursomes out on the same tee times and carts will be permitted with one person or immediate household per cart

- **Health Clubs, Retail and Personal Care Services (salons)**

- Health clubs, gyms and fitness studios can provide one-on-one personal training in indoor facilities and outdoor fitness classes of up to ten people

- Hair and spa services, tattoo shops, spas can open with IDPH safety precautions and capacity limits
- **Additional Permitted Activities with 10 Person Limit and Social Distancing with Individuals Outside of Your Home**
 - Non-essential or social gatherings
 - Boating or camping
 - Driving ranges, outdoor shooting ranges, and paintball courses

Business will resume on Tuesday, May 26th for regular hours, Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Village Offices remain closed to the public due to the COVID-19 pandemic, however Village services remain available to residents and businesses.
