### In Response to Restaurant Compliance Inquiries from Residents

The Village of Lombard has more than 150 registered places for eating. The vast majority of Lombard businesses have been operating in compliance with COVID-19 enhanced mitigation measures set forth by the State. While the Village has responded to isolated complaints regarding non-compliance at select Lombard restaurants, these establishments represent only a fraction (less than 2%) of all Lombard places for eating.

In instances where the Village has been notified of business non-compliance, complaints are verified by site visits. Where non-compliance is observed, the Village initially seeks to educate and inform establishments regarding mitigation measures, documents the incident, and seeks voluntary



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compliance. Where businesses opt to continue in violation of State requirements, the Village is cooperating with State and local authorities on matters of enforcement. Information regarding business non-compliance is documented and shared with public health agencies and/or other regulatory agencies for enforcement purposes. Businesses who continue to operate in defiance of State requirements risk consequences including loss of licensure, citations, fines and additional liability.

As stated above, the vast majority of Lombard businesses have made accommodations to comply with State enhanced mitigation efforts. Particularly during this difficult time, the Village encourages all residents to support local businesses and restaurants whenever possible.

The [DuPage County Health Department COVID-19 dashboard](#), shows the number of lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases in each municipality. As of November 17<sup>th</sup>, there have been a total of 1,635 lab confirmed cases in Lombard.
